#### **PROFILE**

I am Course Leader of the BA Acting.

I trained as an actor at The Guildhall School of Music and Drama and have worked extensively within theatre and TV. I have been a member of the Royal Shakespeare Company and whilst there directed a devised theatre piece as part of *Not the RSC Production* at the Almeida Theatre after receiving an Arts Council of Great Britain bursary to develop the production which was performed at the Bloomsbury Theatre. As an actress I worked with James Baldwin on *Amen Corner* and also featured in the <u>BBC Radio 4 - James Baldwin's Last Amen</u>. I worked with director Claude Purdy (in *Joe Turner Come and Gone*, August Wilson's first professional production), Adrian Noble, Roger Mitchell, Katie Mitchell and Phyllida Lloyd. I have been a commissioned writer, having had two plays broadcast on BBC Radio 4.

I joined Central in 1998, after training on the Voice Course where I gained my Postgraduate Diploma in Voice. I worked on the BA (Hons) Acting course, as a specialist in Voice, Speech and Text. I assisted the Head of Acting in the validation of the undergraduate three-course training model and established the Vocal pedagogy on the BA Acting and several MA courses, notably MA Classical Acting and MA Music Theatre, teaching on both courses.

As a Senior Lecturer, I have taught on a variety of courses including short business courses within the School of Community and Professional Development. I have acquired the depth and breadth of teaching experience and knowledge that can be adapted to meet different and selected audiences.

I am an active member of external networks such as ICV and VASTA and I am a fellow of the RSA.
