

Two married couples reunite alongside dozens of now aged Follies showgirls for a final send-off to their theatre, slated for demolition. Fantasies long dead rise up through the floor and athletic tap, clowning and burlesque routines trace the breaking psyches of the main characters.

With a muscular and eerie approach to numbers including 'Broadway Baby', 'Losing My Mind' and 'I'm Still Here', Follies is a dynamic and gutsy showcase for this year's MA Music Theatre actors.

They wait. They wait.

And, finally, out of the darkness, the River brings forth a body to be claimed. But who is it? To whom does it belong?

And why is the army so fearful?

'Somewhere right now somewhere else in this country, maybe your last command, someone is losing a piece of paper, erasing a signature, burning a body to cover your ass. And you... cover mine.'

A brutal, absurd meditation on the consequences of over-reaching State Power, informed by Dorfman's own experience living in Chile under the dictatorship of Augusto Pinochet.



Carried by an ensemble of colourful characters, what begins as a comedy ends as something quite different: a prescient examination of democracy and revolution, a grim portrait of recycled violence and class division.

This production is a quick-moving, stripped-back, contemporary take on *Fuente Ovejuna*, which is as politically spiky now as it was in Spain, 1612.



Where did this crisis come from?


What are the infected trying to communicate? And who is patient zero?
