COVID-19 Code of Behaviours

February 2022 Update

Central's COVID-19 Code of Behaviours sets out the expectation around how students should conduct themselves to keep each other safe on campus.

The School's COVID Secure Risk Assessment details the control measures in place which must be adhered to by all students and staff. All steps that have been taken have been approved by the School's Health and Safety Recovery Team, and may change in the future.

Central treats all staff and students with respect and seeks to provide a positive working and learning environment free from discrimination, harassment or victimisation. This includes denouncing all racist COVID-19 conspiracy theories, racist COVID-19 origin narratives and all unlawful discrimination or harassment targeted at members of our community. This behaviour will not be tolerated.

In addition, there may be temporary or course specific additional measures as advised by our local public health team which may be communicated by e-mail following an outbreak at Central.
